Good progress is being made with the next ICLAM conference in Madrid.

Javier Aparicio and Ana Villaneuva of the local Organising committee met with the ICLAM Bureau to present the preliminary Conference program. A new format with symposiums was approved. There will be 11 symposiums and 3 workshops, to be repeated along the afternoon, on Tuesday and Wednesday afternoon. The topics and speakers were agreed upon by the Bureau and organising committee members.

The Keynote address will be given by Dr Fuster on Health, Education and Risk. All speakers will receive a guideline for speakers on the ICLAM conference to emphasize the purpose of the conference. They will also be briefed to bring medical topics into the insurance field so that conclusions can be applied in the decision making process.

The presentation of the optional one-day seminar is still being debated. The scientific committee is not very convinced with this seminar being in English. It may be a very important attraction point for companies to attend the congress but junior underwriters may not be fluent enough in English to understand. On the other hand simultaneous translation into Spanish may not be feasible due to cost and price of the course.

The committee is working towards obtaining continued professional education accreditation points for attending delegates. The APD accreditation certificate will be handled with SEAFORMEC, the Spanish accreditation system for continuous education in Medicine.

5.4 **AMUS (UK)**:

The AMUS, Assurance Medical & Underwriting Society, had a very well attended meeting at the RAC Club in London on the 16th March, starting with a buffet lunch and the AGM Presentations on psychiatry until 5pm. This covered topics like the curability of mental illness, whether psychiatric patients should qualify for enhanced annuities, stress related sickness absence and the epidemiology of psychiatry and current trends in the treatment of mental disorders.

On the 8th June we had an afternoon session at the RAF Club in London on recent advances in MS and touched upon the treatment of epilepsy. This was followed by a very nice buffet dinner. The format of having a meeting combined with a chance to meet colleagues and friends with food and drinks works very well.

The next meeting is on the 18th September, Lucid 2 in Cardiff, www.lucidconference.org, which runs for two and a half days and has a very comprehensive programme and should do as well as the Lucid 1 held in Stratford on Avon.

In November another meeting at the RAF club to finish the year, topics are not yet decided. The combined doctors and underwriters, AMUS, is doing well, membership is increasing but we are very short of doctors. This will take time to sort out as there are complicated processes relating to the certification of doctors as CMO's in the insurance industry and even the cover that they need for professional indemnity insurance as medical advisers to the industry.

Normal professional indemnity insurance covers the doctor in case a patient goes to court for some kind of litigation. How much cover is available if the CMO makes a mistake in advising an insurer is not yet clear, particularly as many CMO's work part time and are self employed. Hopefully all this will become clearer in the next year.

5.5 **AMCAP (France):**

The Annual scientific meeting of AMCAP was held in Paris on May, 20th 2011, focused on the needs for long term care in the future and the respective role of public health insurance vs/ private insurance. The meeting was a success, gathering some 200 doctors involved in the business of life insurance medicine (medical underwriting and claims management) and a few executives and senior underwriters or claims managers.

It has also been discussed about the new agreement signed between the French federation of insurance companies (FFSA) and the Government. This new agreement aims to facilitate the access to life insurance of people with an aggravated risk of health and to give them the best possible coverage. This new agreement has been signed on Feb.1st and should be implemented by the end of 2011. 5.6 **ASISA (South Africa):**

The South African insurance community is keeping a close eye on the developments in Europe with regards to the gender discrimination issue, and some discussion forums have already taken place. This may result in an official ASISA position document.

The joint forum for underwriters and doctors in Insurance Medicine, SASIMU, has held two meetings in Cape Town and Johannesburg respectively. These were well attended and very successful. The Cape Town discussions were about inflammatory bowel disease, feedback from the ELHUA conference, and

sleep apnoea. The next meeting is a breakfast session on August 10th with two speakers, one on the impact of sports injuries on underwriting, and the other on the risk assessment of private pilots.

The Johannesburg SASIMU chapter discussed the long term effects of gestational diabetes at their meeting in May, and will have an actuarial presentation on mortality ratings at their next meeting scheduled for August 11th.

5.7 **ANZIMA (Australia)**:

Over the last few months, ANZIMA went through a phase of radical review. Because sponsor moneys, expected to be made available from most, if not all insurance and reinsurance companies in the market, fell short (only a few insurers made a payment towards ANZIMA), the executive committee decided to abandon the original plan of establishing an independent group advising the industry on insurance medicine related matters and fostering education in insurance medicine.

The paid sponsorship funds were returned. Currently, discussions are underway as regards the future of the association. Getting under the organisational umbrella of the Australian Life Underwriters and Claims Association (ALUCA http://www.aluca.com/) appears to be one option. Another possibility is to form an affiliation with the Australian and New Zealand Institute of Insurance and Finance (ANZIIF http://www.theinstitute.com.au/).

5.9 **DVfVW (German):**

As in the UK, the former insurance medicine section of the DVfVW (German Association of Insurance Science) has now been opened up to underwriting and claims experts as well. This reflects the interdisciplinary cooperation in many insurance companies, whose medical officers are becoming an increasingly integral part of life insurance business.

Since the ICLAM 2007 in Berlin, which was a great success and attended by many underwriters, the annual conference for insurance medicine, underwriting and claims assessment now deals with medical and non-medical issues that are relevant to all three of these professional groups. The conference takes place once a year and primarily addresses matters relating to life and health insurers. This year's conference (8th of June in Düsseldorf) dealt mainly with questions of cardiology, occupational medicine and claims assessment, legal impacts at a national and European level and long term sequelae of juvenile oncological diseases.

A scientific symposium presenting guidelines for professional expert opinions on mental health problems and psychosomatic disorders will take place on September 5-6 2011. These guidelines for psychiatric and psychosomatic disorders have been developed in a multidisciplinary cooperation with several German universities and have been sponsored by the German Insurance Association (GDV).

In the future, these guidelines are to be taken as the standard as regards content and methodology for expert reports in notifications of claim on the ability to work in the case of mental health problems and psychosomatic disorders. Their importance is reflected in the fact that these guidelines have

been submitted to leading medical associations for authorisation. The guidelines are intended to provide objectivity and validity for expert reports and to reduce the often protracted litigation that is unsatisfactory for all concerned and consequently necessitates a repetition of expert reviews.

5.10 **GAV (Netherlands):**

The GAV (Dutch association of medical advisors in private insurance affairs) was founded September 24 1901, together with AIMECA, the predecessor of ICLAM. The same year our Japanese and Danish colleagues established their insurance medicine associations: AIMJ and FLF. The GAV will celebrate it's 110 years of existence September 30 2011, and congratulates ICLAM, AIMJ and FLF with their own 110th anniversary.
